Dear Parents and Carers,

A warm welcome back to St Monica's for Summer Term 2024. Our pupils looked happy and well rested after the Easter Break and looked very smart upon their return.

In Summer Term, we have a host of activities, enrichment days and outward bound trips planned. We also plan to bring back the St Monica's Summer Fayre, we will host our annual Sports Day and have residentials for Year 5 and Year 6. This action packed term starts with our "Safer Sefton; Safer Pupils" initiative on Wednesday.

This initiative will be celebrated by 84 schools across Sefton. When Thomas Gray arrive, we will have refreshments, posters and a finish line to welcome them. Our intrepid group will then take the baton and follow a route up Fernhill Road to Bedford Road Primary, with staff both on foot and in a car to ensure a safe journey.

I have been attempting to jog over the Easter Holidays so I can keep up, wish me luck (it's a good job we have marathon runners in our staff base who will ably assist me). If you live on the route, please come out and encourage the pupils as we pass by.

Wednesday is an excellent opportunity to celebrate what makes Sefton so special, we will teach our pupils how to "think safe: think healthily". It is great to see Sefton pull together and link the different wards and parishes together - it should be a great day.
