## **Growing Closer to God**

In its simplest form, prayer is defined as "talking to God." It is our own personal time where we open our hearts to our Heavenly Father and bring everything in our head and hearts to him. Through the Apostle Paul, God asked us to pray.

"Finally, our brothers and sisters, pray for us, that the Lord's message may continue to spread rapidly and be received with honour"

Thessalonians 3: 1-2

Prayer and liturgy can be a powerful force for change in our lives, and the importance of doing it on a daily basis is instilled in our children. Communication is the foundation for success in any relationship. When we communicate openly and freely with each other, we get to know each other as individuals. This principle also applies to our relationship with God. By talking to God, we can learn more about who He is and what plan He has for us.

#### Prayer Has a Purpose

It is important that our children understand that there is a purpose to prayer. Jesus frequently prayed during His life on Earth. He had a reason for doing so. Our prayers are something that God deeply desires. Children are encouraged to pray in different ways according to their age and personal development. The most important aspect of prayer for children is that they realise it is their way of communicating with God and is first and foremost a personal occasion.

- Learning traditional Catholic prayers

#### **Hymn Practice**

Each Key Stage gathers together to sing songs of praise to God and practise hymns and songs that we use for our collective worship and for Mass.

## Child Led Prayer and liturgy

Each week, different children in each class prepare and lead their class in worship. In Key Stage One the children are guided by adults to prepare for this. In Key Stage Two the children independently plan their own worship.

## Teacher Led Prayer and liturgy

Teachers plan weekly worships for their class to allow time for reflection and prayer based on a religious theme.

## Celebration Prayer and liturgy Worship

Each Friday, our children come together for a time of collective worship led by our Assistant Head. We also celebrate the achievements of the school that week. We end the week together by thanking God for all He has helped us to achieve that week.

#### Masses

Throughout the year, our entire school community will attend St Monica's Church to celebrate masses with our Parish Priest Father Ged and our Parish community. Children help to prepare and lead the Mass through scripture readings, prayers and bringing up the gifts during offertory. On different occasions parents and guardians are invited to join us for Mass.
