St Monica's: Our Vision

The Early Years curriculum at St. Monica's is taught in themes throughout the year with flexibility to capitalise on learning opportunities through children's interests as they arise. This thematic approach supports inter-relation of curriculum areas to allow for mastery and depth in their learning; 'All areas of learning and development are important and interconnected' (Dfe, 2021).

Teachers have identified the key skills of each theme and consideration has been given to ensure progression across topics throughout both year groups and across every child's journey from Nursery to Reception. In addition to this we collaborate with subject teams to ensure progression throughout St Monica's.

Themes are carefully mapped out to give depth of coverage for all areas of the EYFS framework throughout the year. For each topic we provide first hand experiences to promote cultural capital and inspire interest and enthusiasm.







What is Foundation Stage at St Monica's?

Foundation Stage is from the beginning of Nursery to the end of Reception and has its own separate curriculum.

The curriculum is **play based** and children are encouraged to become **independent learners**, **investigating and exploring** through hands on and practical activities.







What is Foundation Stage at St Monica's?

There are 7 areas of learning within the EYFS and all the teaching that we do relates to these areas.

The **Prime areas** are the most important areas of learning:

- Communication & Language,
- Personal Social and Emotional Development
- Physical Development.

Whilst the **Prime areas** are developing we also teach the **specific areas of learning** which are:

- Literacy
- Maths
- Understanding the World
- Expressive Art and Design






What is Foundation Stage at St Monica's?

Transition Timeline

Month	Timeline information
June	Parents information meeting.
July	Stay and play sessions.
September	6-9th September - 1:1 meeting with each child and their family and teacher.
Week commencing 11th September	Children begin nursery in small groups, accessing shorter sessions, which increase in length.
Week commencing 18th September	If your child is ready, they will stay for their full sessions from this week.

If your child is not ready for a full day, don't worry! We will work with you to settle your child happily into Nursery.

Snack and Lunchtimes

Snacks

Healthy snacks are served each morning and afternoon. The drinks available are milk and water. The children are given a variety of snacks throughout the week, which will include a selection of fruit and vegetables, toast, rice cakes or crackers. Please discuss any dietary requirements with staff.

You can choose to pay snack money weekly, monthly or termly.

- Cost for children who attend for 15 hours is £1 per week.
- Cost for children who attend for 30 hours is £2 per week.

Lunches

On the days which your child will attend Nursery for the full day, they will need to bring in a lunch from home.

Please note, all grapes, tomatoes, olives etc. must be cut lengthways to reduce choking hazard. Please refer to our school packed lunch policy when preparing lunches.





Partnership with Parents

We value the importance of parental involvement and strive to build positive relationships, working in partnership to support their children's learning and development. As EEF research has found 'Parental engagement in early years education is consistently associated with children's subsequent academic success' (EEF, 2018). Getting your child "Nursery Ready"

Your child will really benefit from being as independent as possible when they start Nursery.

You can support your child to be ready for Nursery by:

- Sharing books and nursery rhymes
- Supporting your child to recognise their coat and begin to put it on independently
- Encouraging themselves to dress and undress themselves when they use the toilet
- Helping them to be able to play independently
- Allowing your child the opportunity to make choices
- Encouraging them to tidy up their toys and books after use
- Reducing their screen time
- Encouraging your child to talk and answer questions
