As part of our home-school links, we aim to keep you fully informed of the curriculum being studied by your children. This term Year 6 will be studying the topics listed in the overview below.

Year 6 - Term 3.2		
R.E.	Healing Children will learn that the Church believes that the anointing of the sick is one of the seven sacraments, it is intended to strengthen those who are ill. Common Good Children will learn that common good is central to the Catholic Social teaching and is intrinsically linked to social justice: at the heart of this teaching is the respect for the human person made in the image of God. Prayer and liturgy Children will have daily opportunities to reflect and worship, helping their spiritual and moral development.	
English: Reading	Class Novel: Carrie's War by Nina Bawden Pupil Reads/Reading Comprehension: Reading is delivered through daily reading sessions with a clear focus. Dedicated reading time is given to specific genres and key skills. Children have the opportunity to read a variety of fiction and non-fiction using a combination of 'reading for pleasure' books and levelled reading scheme books; both are used to promote fluency and enjoyment.	
English: Writing	Short burst writing opportunities / Residential Children will refine and develop their writing skills covering a range of genres including narrative non- narrative and poetry.	
English: SPAG	Grammar. Punctuation and Spelling: Children will be consolidating prior learning and revising key grammatical concepts. Children will revise key spelling rules and Year 5 / 6 statutory spellings using Spelling Frame www.spellingframe.co.uk	
Maths	Themed projects, consolidation and problem solving Children will continue to develop and revise their core arithmetic and reasoning skills. Children will be encouraged to use Times Table Rockstars to support this www.ttrockstars.com	
Science	Animals Including Humans Children will identify and name the main parts of the human circulatory system, and describe the functions of the heart, blood vessels and blood. They will also describe the ways in which nutrients and water are transported within animals, including humans and recognise the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the way their bodies function.	
P.E.	Striking & Fielding: Cricket Striking: Children will practise skills in cricket including bowling and striking the ball as well as fielding and catching: Athletics Running: Children will develop their sprinting, jumping and throwing techniques developing power, control and technique.	
Design and Technology	Cooking and Nutrition - Traditional British Food Children will learn about, taste and evaluate some traditional dishes. They will follow a recipe including a method for vegetable stew/scouse.	
Computing	3D Modelling Children will develop their knowledge and understanding of using a computer to produce 3D models. They will initially familiarise themselves with working in a 3D space, moving, resizing, and duplicating objects. They will then create hollow objects using placeholders and combine multiple objects Computing Communication & Collaboration Children will look at how the internet facilitates online communication and collaboration; they complete shared projects online and evaluate different methods of communication.	
Geography	Mapping and World- Wide Topical Issues Children will use geographical skills to complete fieldwork tasks including; compass points, grid references, symbols and keys (including the use of ordnance survey maps) to build their knowledge of the U.K. and the wider world including world-wide topical issues.	
MFL - Spanish	Holidays - Children will revise clothes, weather, countries and holiday Activities Healthy Living and Ordering food learning names for: food / drink / ice cream and take part in Cafe role play Celebrate Spanish Fiesta (San Fermin) with an end of year Celebration involving Food Tasting	
RSHE	Journey in Love Social and Emotional - Children will develop a secure understanding that stable and caring relationships, which may be of different types, are at the heart of happy families. Physical - Children will explain how human life is conceived. Spiritual - Children will show an understanding of how being made in the image and likeness of God informs decisions and actions when building relationships with others, including life-long relationships.
